

Coxhoe Parish Council Parish Plan 2004 -2010 Progress Report January 2011

During 2004 the Parish Council worked with the village partnerships and other partners to produce a Parish Plan for the years 2004 to 2010. This included Community Appraisals for the villages of Coxhoe and Quarrington Hill. The plan was approved by Coxhoe Parish Council at its special meeting on 22nd February 2005. The plan was a genuine attempt by the Parish Council and working groups from Coxhoe and Quarrington Hill to inspire the community to develop in the way residents had requested through community consultation.

The Parish Plan included a detailed action plan for both villages. This document is a final progress report against the agreed actions.

The review of the Parish Plan commenced in October 2010.
